Boys & Girls Club College Visit Checklist

Member Expectations

Arrive on time for the bus departure.

Wear comfortable shoes and clothes (including a jacket).

Be respectful to all people at all times.

Be an active listener and ask questions.

Be courtesy – say thank you, please and you're welcome.

Use inside voices, even outside.

Technology stays off during sessions.

Stand proud as a positive representative of you, your family, community, school and Boys & Girls Club.

The experience is what you make of it...make it a good one.

Family Expectations

Talk to your child about the upcoming college visit.

Attend a Boys & Girls Club college visit family meeting. If you can't attend, contact the Boys & Girls Club coordinator to set up an individual meeting or phone call.

Sign permission slips.

Participate in the college visit, and complete the necessary district paperwork to serve as a chaperone or volunteer.

Arrive on time for the bus departure and pick-up.

Be an active listener and ask questions.

Remember that you are a role model to all the youth – keep technology away (to the extent possible).

Boys & Girls Club Coordinator/Chaperone Expectations

Be prepared! Have all contact names and numbers, member rosters, emergency contacts, district and school level information – each chaperone should have each adult's cellphone number for safety.

Know your driver's name and cellphone number. Make sure they know where they are going, have a map, drop-off and parking info.

Set up a process for making sure you have all members accounted for at all times by using a counting or buddy system.

Remember, you are a role model to all the members and families – keep technology away (to the extent possible).

Chaperones are in charge of sharing behavioral expectations with members and managing behavior during the college visit. If issues arise, be sure to address it with the member.

Be engaged and guide the visit by asking questions and guiding conversation.
