## General Guidelines

- To make the experience as realistic as possible, allow each teen to complete their own Budget Tracking Form and do the math calculations using calculators or devices with calculators. Feel free to assist if teens need help with any of these tasks.
- If teens need to make a withdrawal from their savings accounts, direct them to the Banking and Investing Station to have this transaction recorded.
- If a teen has little or no funds remaining and still has several stations to visit, encourage them to go to the Financial Counseling Station for advice.

Be sure to write your initials in the appropriate column of the Budget Tracking Form, confirming that the teen has visited this station.

## Entertainment and Travel Guidelines

- Depending on the funds remaining in their Budget Tracking Form, teens may select a vacation option or some other form of entertainment listed on the Entertainment and Travel Expense Summary. Remind them to consider the number of family members who will be participating. Because expenses listed are for one person (unless otherwise noted), you may have to help teens calculate the cost for a family.
- If teens do not have money for a vacation now, encourage them to deposit any money remaining to their savings account. Point out on the Expense Summary how much they need to save per month for one year to take the vacation they desire.
- Teens may encounter a situation at the Life's Unexpected Station that requires them to buy an airline ticket to another city to attend a wedding.
- If teens have money left after deducting entertainment expenses, suggest they consider depositing a portion of the excess in their savings account to earn interest until it is needed. Encourage teens to make an additional contribution to their Investment Portfolio, or direct teens to the Charitable Donations Station to make a contribution.
